



Stories of the second “Step by Step” magazine in December

The main topic of the second magazine of the TV series “Step by Step” is the environmental protection by application of measures to reduce pollution at its very source.

The first story is from Kostolac:

Thermal power plants are major polluters of the environment. In Kostolac’s power plants, the replacing of old filters on chimneys with more powerful electrical filters has started. The first modern ash and slag dumpster was made, and residents of surrounding villages of Kostolac now breathe cleaner air.

The second story comes from Leskovac:

In Serbia, almost all waste water is discharged into rivers without required treatment. All the sewage basin of Leskovac and the surrounding villages goes directly to a small river Veternica, and then to the South Morava River and other rivers. In this city, the solving of this problem has been put to a priority level. At the same time, the central facility for processing waste water is under construction.

The third story is from Kragujevac:

Many people get infected with hepatitis B and C, or HIV, because of contact with needles, ampoules, pads and bandages improperly disposed after use in health institutions. Kragujevac was among the first cities in Serbia that opened a center for the processing of medical waste in accordance with the procedure applied in the European Union.
